Chairman's Chat

This will be my last Chairman's Chat and as I enter the last three months of my tenure I suppose it's inevitable that my mind will be taking me back, not only over the last five years, as Chairman, but over my thirteen years on the committee and indeed fifteen years since first joining East Berks Ramblers in 2002.

I well remember my first walk with the Group, in March 2003. It was led by Bob Bywater-Lees, sadly no longer with us. I remember it started from Maidensgrove Common, and I recall to this day looking out for "the verge on the bend in the road", for parking – still one of my favourite starting points for a walk. But most importantly I recall how welcoming and friendly everybody was that day – glad to say nothing changes in that respect! I also remember my nerves on the day of the very first Group walk I led – from Medmenham on a Sunday in November that same year, and the high level of support everyone gave me.

From that point on it was only a matter of time before John Vint got his claws into me and recruited me onto the committee to take over the role being vacated by Shirley Fogg, who was moving out of the area, co-ordinating the local sales of our RfP books and maps which in those days was carried out by a team of volunteer EBR members. And the rest, as they say, is history. I graduated from that role to that of Publicity Officer and Shows Organiser, which I did for five years until Eve Norton inherited the Shows in 2012.

So what have been the committee's main achievements over the past five years? And I stress these are the committee's achievements, not mine! Well, the walks programmes have continued to expand considerably, not only in terms of the number of regular Sunday and Wednesday walks but also by the introduction of occasional Saturday walks and the monthly strollathons.

Our two most popular RfP walks books have been completely revised and updated – one of them has already been republished, the other is on the point of being so.

Financially, the Group has maintained its very healthy position, and has been able to assist neighbouring Berkshire groups financially with footpath improvement work for the long-term benefit of walkers generally. We have also been able to open negotiations with Ramblers Central Office on the possible use of some of the considerable monies held in the East Berks Endowment Fund, rather than just allowing this to lie idle as it had for so many years. This followed a change in early 2015 in the situation pertaining to the so-called "Missing Link" in the Thames Path at Bridge Gardens, Maidenhead, when RBWM provided a safe, unobstructed footpath for pedestrians along the A4094 (but rest assured, we still stand ready to once again take up the argument for a riverside path whenever this site comes up for redevelopment).

On the subject of rights-of-way generally I'm sure everyone will remember the accolades poured on our group, and indeed on RBWM, at the time of the Ramblers' Big Pathwatch initiative in 2015/16 when our area was found to have one of the very best maintained footpath networks in the country. Unsurprisingly, our relations with the borough's rights-of-way team certainly seems to be on an all-time high at the moment.

So, three months to go and I am looking forward to seeing as many of you as possible at our AGM on 10th November. Full details of the event appear elsewhere in this Newsletter – including a nomination form for your next Chairman. I hope your Group Secretary will receive a number of these!!

Planning and Countryside Matters

Path Warden Activity

My team of path wardens completed the Spring Survey of rights of way on behalf of RBWM, and I sent in my report summarising the findings. There were no major problems found, the paths being in good condition. The wardens spent a total of 150 hours on the work and covered 191 miles in the process.

We currently have all parishes covered but I am still looking for someone to cover the stretch of the Thames Path in our borough, if anyone is interested please contact me.

Path Improvements

The stile replacement programme, where we refund to the Borough the cost of materials for replacement gates, is nearly complete since most of the stiles on our list have been dealt with. There remains a wish list of problems that cannot be tackled due to uncooperative landowners, these will have to await a change of heart/ ownership.

Planning Issues

Berkeley Homes have appealed against RBWM's decision to refuse permission to build 28 houses on the "Poundfield site". We supported the Cookham Society in their objection, since two important public rights of way would be adversely affected.

I mentioned in the last Newsletter the plan to put up a memorial plaque on the new footbridge over The Cut, by Braywick Park, to commemorate the sterling work carried out by our late lamented Footpath Secretary, Margaret Bowdery. This is going ahead and we are in the process of agreeing the wording with the family.

Group Spring 2017 Holiday in the Brecon Beacons

What do you think of, when someone mentions Wales? For me, it's mountains, rain, dragons, more rain, rugby, even more rain. Well the EBR trip to Brecon was unusually lucky, because it didn't rain!

East Berks Ramblers were staying in the lovely surroundings of Nythfa House which is run by HF Holidays. 30 ramblers enjoyed four nights at this centre at the beginning of June, with 3 days of vigorous guided walking. The weather on day 1 was light cloud, although the tops of the mountains were not covered giving spectacular views to walkers on the harder and medium walks! Days 2 and 3 had more sun – and more spectacular views – but making it important to carry a good supply of water when setting out.

Over the course of the 3 days we explored 3 areas of the National Park. On day 1 the walks were to the West, topping the Black Mountain. Day 2 was in the centre, with Pen-y-Fan and the Beacons, while Day 3 focussed on the east, with the harder and medium walks straddling the Black Mountains culminating in a final descent into Hay-on-Wye.

Personally I found the walks challenging, and I was happy to opt for the easier walks on Days 2 and 3. Some fitter members managed the harder walks on all 3 days. Superb scenery throughout, excellently managed both by the HF staff and by our Arthur. With excellent company and superb food, a thoroughly satisfying holiday overall!

The Great Stones Way and The Ridgeway 2017/18

3.00pm. A talk by Robin Harford entitled "Walking With Plants: A Wild Edible Journey Through The Landscape"

Robin Harford is a self-taught ethnobotanist and has spent over a decade travelling, researching, recording and uncovering the traditional and contemporary use of wild plants in human culture. More recently his work has taken him to Africa, India, SE Asia, and Europe. He writes: "Plants are the foundation of human culture. Without them, humans would simply not exist." During his 45-60 minute presentation Robin will take you on a journey through the edible landscapes of Britain. His plant stories reveal the forgotten history of Britain's botanical heritage. Weaving folklore, anecdotes, personal experience and history, he reveals the amazing world of wild plants in a way that will enchant and delight the listener. Be prepared for a journey down the Green Path that will forever transform your walks in the wild.

Robin Harford is the creator of Eatweeds.co.uk which is considered to be the UK's leading wild food foraging site, and has been running foraging courses since 2008. He is a co-director of Plants & Healers International, a non-profit organization that connects people, plants and healers around the world.

The cost for the 3 course lunch is £22 and the booking form, giving menu choices, is given at the end of this Newsletter. Bookings are now being taken for this event.


